

Chung Yuan Christian University Guidelines for the Prevention and Management of Seasonal Influenza

Approved by Meeting of Health Services and Dietary Committee at 2nd semester of 2025 on June 23, 2025

- Article 1. In order to effectively prevent and control the spread of seasonal influenza on campus and to protect the health of students, faculty, and staff, Chung Yuan Christian University has established the Guidelines for the Prevention and Management of Seasonal Influenza at Chung Yuan Christian University in accordance with “ The School Health Act ” and relevant epidemic prevention guidelines issued by the Taiwan Centers for Disease Control, Ministry of Health and Welfare.
- Article 2. Seasonal influenza refers to influenza caused by infection with influenza A viruses (subtypes H1N1 or H3N2) or influenza B viruses. In the event that a case is determined to be a suspected cluster infection with potential for further spread, or meets the definition of an unexplained febrile illness cluster, the incident shall be reported to the local competent health authority in accordance with relevant regulations, and necessary cooperation shall be provided for the epidemiological investigation and subsequent disease prevention and control measures.
- Article 3. In the event that a pandemic influenza is confirmed by the competent health authority, actions shall be taken in accordance with the relevant regulations of the central and local authorities and “ the CYCU Regulations Governing Prevention of Infectious Diseases on Campus ”. If necessary, the Emergency Response Team shall be activated, and cooperation with health authorities shall be carried out to implement follow-up epidemic control measures.
- Article 4. Upon notification of a suspected or confirmed case, the Health Services Division shall initiate case follow-up in accordance with relevant protocols. During the infectious period, the individual concerned shall comply with case management and health monitoring measures, so as to ensure the provision of continuous health support and to facilitate their orderly return to campus and successful reintegration into university life.
- Article 5. For areas on campus where suspected clusters of seasonal influenza have stayed or been active, the Center for Environmental Protection and Occupational Safety and Health shall be notified to arrange for disinfection procedures.
- Article 6. During disease outbreaks, the Health Services Division shall actively promote diversified epidemic prevention education to strengthen faculty, staff, and students’ accurate understanding of influenza prevention and control. Recommended measures include wearing masks, practicing proper hand hygiene, and observing cough etiquette to effectively reduce the risk of virus transmission. In alignment with government policies, the Health Services Division shall facilitate campus vaccination promotion efforts to support disease prevention and self-protection awareness.
- Article 7. These guidelines, having been approved by the Health Services and Dietary Committee, are submitted to the president for approval and promulgation, with the

same process followed for any future amendments.
