

CYCU Implementation Regulations Governing “Student with Poverty Fellowship”

Passed at 787th School Administration Council on April 10, 2003
Amended and passed at 801st School Administration Council on June 3, 2004
Amended and passed at 826th School Administration Council on July 13, 2006
Amended per the official letter under Yuan-Mi-Zi No. 1050002657 dated August 25, 2016

Article 1. CYCU hereby establishes the Regulations in order to care and help its students whose parents are unemployed involuntarily or from the underprivileged family complete their school courses successfully.

Article 2. Any of CYCU’s undergraduates (exclusive of deferred students) with the average academic performance attaining 60 points or more in the previous semester and good conduct who satisfies any of the following conditions may file the application, and will be admitted as the first priority in the following order:

1. Those with the low-income households certificate issued by any county/city government;
2. Those whose parent (or guardian) suffers from critical illness and, therefore, the family’s financial position is affected adversely;
3. Those whose parent (or guardian) has no working ability;
4. Those whose parent or guardian is unemployed involuntarily and whose family is indeed in great necessity.

If multiple applicants satisfy said conditions equivalently, the applicants shall be admitted as the first priority in the order based on the applicants’ academic performance.

Article 3. The applicant shall submit the following information:

1. One (1) application form (Attachment 1)
2. One (1) copy of the transcript
3. Other related information helpful for the application

Article 4. Application procedure:

The applicant shall be recommended by the advisor and reported by the department chair to the Office of Student Affairs within two (2) weeks after the school begins at 2nd semester of each school year, and then authorized within one (1) month.

Article 5. Subsidy policy:

The quota per school year shall be adjusted subject to the annual budget and shall be no more than 120 students. The students passing the review may receive the fellowship in the amount of NT\$10,000 for the given school year, and those who apply for working part time in the CYCU will be admitted as the first priority.

Article 6. The application for the fellowship may be filed together with the application for any other fellowship/scholarship.

Article 7. The Regulations shall be promulgated by the President and enforced upon approval of School Administration Council. The same shall apply where the Regulations are amended.
