CYCU Academic Excellence Award and Subject Excellence Award Regulations

Chapter 1: General Provisions

Article 1: Chung Yuan Christian University (hereinafter referred to as the University), based on the concept of holistic education, encourages students to actively pursue academic excellence. Therefore, the "Chung Yuan Christian University Academic Excellence Award and Subject Excellence Award Regulations" (hereinafter referred to as the Regulations) are established.

Article 2: Award categories and recipients:

- 1. Academic Excellence Award: The recipients are undergraduate students of the University. Students who have extended their studies, transferred, withdrawn, or graduated, and those who have applied for course suspension in the previous semester are not eligible.
- 2. Basic and Professional Academic Excellence Awards: The recipients are undergraduate students of the University. Students who have transferred, withdrawn, or graduated, and those who have applied for course suspension in the previous semester are not eligible.

Chapter 2: Academic Excellence Award

Article 3: Eligibility for the award:

- 1. For classes with 30 or more students: The top 10% of students in the class based on the average academic performance of the previous semester, with the top three students in each class being awarded (additional awards will be given in case of ties).
- 2. For classes with fewer than 30 students:
 - (1)For classes with 20 to 29 students, the top two students in the class will be awarded (additional awards will be given in case of ties).
 - (2) For classes with 10 to 19 students, the top student in the class will be awarded (additional awards will be given in case of ties).
 - (3)For classes with fewer than 10 students, no awards will be given unless the top student's average score is higher than or equal to the lowest score of the top students in other classes of the same grade in the same college.

- 3. Students must not have received any demerits in the previous semester.
- Article 4: Implementation: The awards are given once per semester. The Office of Student Affairs verifies and approves the recipients, and the respective departments (including bachelor's degree programs) present the awards.

Article 5: Award content:

- 1. A certificate of award.
- 2. Cash prizes: NT\$3,000 for the first place, NT\$2,500 for the second place, and NT\$2,000 for the third place.

Chapter 3: Basic Academic Excellence Award

Article 6: This award applies to the basic subjects of the unified examination, including English, Calculus, General Physics, General Chemistry, and Introduction to Computers.

Article 7: Eligibility for the award:

- 1. The top 2% of students in the subject examination.
- 2. Students must not have received any demerits in the previous semester.

Article 8: Award content:

- 1. A certificate of award.
- 2. A cash prize of NT\$1,000.
- Article 9: Implementation: The respective departments provide the list of eligible students and related information. The Office of Student Affairs verifies and approves the recipients, and the respective departments present the awards in public.

Chapter 4: Professional Academic Excellence Award

Article 10: The award subjects are determined by each department (including bachelor's degree programs) based on 10% of the required professional subjects (rounded to the nearest whole number). The award subjects must be approved by the department council or relevant curriculum committee and submitted to the Office of Student Affairs before the start of each semester.

Article 11: Eligibility for the award:

- 1. For subjects with 30 or more students: The top three students in the class based on the academic performance of the previous semester (additional awards will be given in case of ties).
- 2. For subjects with fewer than 30 students:
 - (1)For subjects with 20 to 29 students, the top two students in the class will be awarded (additional awards will be given in case of ties).

- (2) For subjects with 10 to 19 students, the top student in the class will be awarded (additional awards will be given in case of ties).
- (3)For subjects with fewer than 10 students, no awards will be given unless the top student's score is higher than or equal to the lowest score of the top students in other subjects of the same grade in the same college.
- 3. Students must not have received any demerits in the previous semester.

Article 12: Award content:

A certificate of award.

- Article 13: Implementation: The respective departments provide the list of eligible students and related information. The Office of Student Affairs verifies and approves the recipients, and the respective departments present the awards in public.
- Article 14: These regulations are approved by the administrative council and announced by the president. Amendments follow the same procedure.
