

CYCU Hygiene and Health Regulations

- Article 1. To promote the health and wellness of faculty, staff, and students, maintain physical well-being, and enhance national health, these guidelines are established in accordance with the Ministry of Education's "School Health Act."
- Article 2. The planning and implementation of health and wellness programs are managed by the Health Services Division, the Office of Student Affairs. Each academic year, the Health Service Division will present a health and wellness plan as well as an annual report of the Health Services and Dietary Committee Meeting.
- Article 3. Students, faculty, and staff (Including retirees) and their spouses, parents, and children with medical needs may receive medical attention at the Health Service Division during working hours. Services include internal and external medicine. Student ID, service certificate, or other relevant documentation is needed to access said services.
- Article 4. In cases of emergencies or severe illness on campus involving students, faculty, or staff, immediate emergency response measures should follow the "CYCU Directions Governing Treatment of Emergency Injuries and Sickness of Faculty and Students" During office hours, the Health Service Group should be notified; outside office hours, the Campus Security Center should be contacted. Medical expenses are the responsibility of the individual.
- Article 5. To establish a student health management system, the university conducts regular health check-ups for students and provides health counseling and referrals for corrective treatment based on the results.
- Article 6. Students with conditions such as heart disease, asthma, epilepsy, diabetes, hemophilia, cancer, mental illness, rare diseases, or other major illnesses or disabilities should be documented and their conditions communicated to home-room advisors, counseling personnel, and the Office of Physical Education. Adjustments to coursework or activities may be made as necessary
- Article 7. The Health Services Division shall administer vaccinations in accordance with health authorities' regulations.
- Article 8. Faculty, staff, or students diagnosed with infectious diseases or at risk of spreading infections on campus must seek medical diagnosis and treatment at healthcare facilities and comply with the university's and/or health authorities' management measures.
- Article 9. The oversight of campus food hygiene is managed by the "Dietary Hygiene Audit Team," with regular inspections of campus dining facilities conducted by Health Service Division representatives and student representatives.
- Article 10. The Health Services Division shall regularly organize campus health promotion activities and initiatives to encourage healthy lifestyle habits.
- Article 11. These regulations have been approved by the Administrative Council Meeting and are submitted to the school president for promulgation and implementation. The same applies to any amendments.
