CYCU Regulations Governing Scholarship for the Outstanding Mainland Chinese Students

- Article 1. These regulations are established to recruit outstanding Mainland Chinese degree students to study at Chung Yuan Christian University.
- Article 2. The number of Outstanding Mainland Chinese Student Scholarships (hereinafter referred to as the Scholarship) is up to five freshmen in the bachelor's program, six students from sophomore to senior year, and four students in the master's and doctoral programs. The number of scholarships may be adjusted based on circumstances and may not be fully awarded.
- Article 3. The Scholarship is reviewed and decided by a committee formed by the Office of Student Affairs. The committee consists of ten to thirteen members appointed by the President. The Dean of Student Affairs, the Dean of International Affairs, the Deputy Dean of International Affairs, and the Director of the Office of Student Affairs' International Student Counseling Group are ex-officio members. The remaining members are faculty representatives recommended by each college, serving a one-year term. Colleges with fewer than five academic units may not recommend representatives.

Article 4. Eligibility for the Scholarship:

- 1. Freshmen in the bachelor's program: Students who meet the first-tier score in the Mainland Chinese Joint Admissions Committee's entrance exam and are selected based on their reported preferences at the time of admission.
- 2. Students from sophomore to senior year in the bachelor's program: Students with an average academic score of 85 or above in the previous academic year.
- 3. Master's and doctoral students: Master's students must be in their first or second year, and doctoral students must be in their first to fourth year, with an average academic score of 85 or above in the previous academic year or have published papers, recommended by their advisor and department.

Students who have been approved for course suspension in the previous academic year are not eligible to apply.

- Article 5. The Scholarship amounts are NT\$20,000 for freshmen in the bachelor's program, NT\$30,000 for students from sophomore to senior year, NT\$60,000 for master's students, and NT\$100,000 for doctoral students. The scholarship for master's and doctoral students is disbursed in two installments, one for each semester.
- Article 6. The Scholarship funds come from 20% of the tuition and fees paid by Mainland Chinese students each year.

Article 7. These regulations are approved by the Student Affairs Meeting and reported to the President for promulgation and implementation. Amendments follow the same procedure.
